It's So Easy To Recycle in Post Falls

Post Falls Curbside Recycling Service provides an efficient, cost effective and safe recycling option for a significant portion of our trash. The diversion of these recyclable materials will prolong the life of our landfill, save natural resources and promote a healthier environment. The curbside recycling service includes pick up of the following recyclables.

Recommended way to load your recycling bin:

Top Tray - Newspaper, Magazines, Cardboard, and Batteries

Green Bin: Milk Jugs, Tin Cans

Blue Bin: Pop Bottles, Aluminum Cans

Since amounts of each type of recyclable will vary from household to household, it may at times, be necessary to load your bin other than the recommended way. Please be sure to secure the lid on the bin.

YES! Curbside Takes:

NEWSPAPER In paper bags or loose

Anything that comes with your newspaper is OK to recycle.

MAGAZINES Glossy and slick paper only

CORRUGATED CARDBOARD

1'x2' pieces

No waxed, cardboard or soda/beer cases.

Place in, next to, or under your recycle bin.

STEEL/TIN CANS Rinse, remove labels, flatten.

ALUMINUM CANS No special preparation necessary

HOUSEHOLD BATTERIES Flashlight, lantern, button batteries/

Place in sealed plastic bag on top of bin.

PHONE BOOKS Annually, watch the newspaper for details

PLASTIC POP BOTTLES & MILK JUGS Rinse, remove lids & lid ring./ Flatten. Labels are OK.

What If?

...the truck didn't come?

Call City Hall at 777-4504 for pick up

...I have a question about my bill?

Call City Hall at 777-4504

...my bin was lost or stolen?

Call City Hall at 777-4504

...I put in recyclables not in the program?

The driver will leave the materials in the bin with a tag.

...I move?

The bin is property of the City and **MUST** be left at the house for the next occupant.



The collection day for recyclables will be the SAME day, but not necessarily the same time, as your garbage collection. Just put your bin next to your garbage cans. Be sure to put your bins out by 6:30 a.m.

NO! Curbside does not take:

Junk mail, catalogs, books

Glass

Vehicle batteries, motor oil, antifreeze

Colored plastic, margarine tubs, yogurt cups

Cereal boxes, 6-pack boxes

Scrap metals such as brass or copper

Wet or dirty newspapers

Wet or dirty corrugated cardboard
