



WATER WISE CONSERVATION MEASURES – SUMMER 2012

CITY ORDINANCE SAYS “NO OUTSIDE IRRIGATION” FROM 12 NOON TO 6 PM. CUSTOMERS ARE ALLOWED TO WATER NEW PLANTS AND LAWNS THAT ARE NEWLY HYDROSEEDED.

ODD NUMBERED ADDRESSES ARE ASKED TO VOLUNTEER TO WATER ON MONDAY, WEDNESDAY AND FRIDAY

EVEN NUMBERED ADDRESSES ARE ASKED TO VOLUNTEER TO WATER ON TUESDAY, THURSDAY AND SATURDAY

“THE CITY IS NOT LOOKING TO GO OUT AND STOP KIDS FROM USING THE SLIP N’ SLIDE OR CITIZENS FROM WATERING THEIR NEW PLANTS. WE’RE JUST ASKING THEM TO CONSERVE WATER DURING THE HOTTEST PART OF THE DAY WHEN IRRIGATING DOES THE LEAST AMOUNT OF GOOD.”

13.12.030: IRRIGATION AND OUTSIDE WATERING:

The use of city water for outside watering and irrigation is prohibited from the hours of twelve o’clock (12:00) noon to six o’clock (6:00) P.M. except when an irrigation system is being operated temporarily for repair or maintenance purposes only. The mayor or his designee is authorized to declare a water shortage/emergency when the circumstances and weather support the potential for water shortage/emergency. Upon making the declaration of a shortage or emergency, the mayor or his designee has the authority to additionally restrict, in any manner deemed appropriate, the use of water from the city’s water system for irrigation and outside watering. Such restrictions may include limitations upon the hours, type and location of water usage or may allow disconnection of users who fail to comply with restrictions.

Note: USAGE FEE FOR ALL USERS ON A PER THOUSAND GALLON BASIS:

Each 1,000 gallon unit or any portion thereof for residential and irrigation accounts; 0 to 49,000 gallons = \$.97 per 1,000.

50,000 gallons or more = \$1.41 per 1,000.
