National Public Safety Telecommunicator's Week

Whereas, emergencies can occur at any time that require Police, Fire, or Emergency Medical Services; and

Whereas, when an emergency occurs the prompt response of Police Officers, Firefighters, and Paramedics is critical to the protection of life and preservation of property; and

Whereas, the safety of our Police Officers and Firefighters is dependent upon the quality and accuracy of information obtained from citizens who telephone the Post Falls Communications Center; and

Whereas, Public Safety Telecommunicators are the first and most critical contact our citizens have with Emergency Services; and


Whereas, Public Safety Telecommunicators are the single vital link for our Police Officers, Firefighters, and Emergency Medical personnel by monitoring their activities by radio, providing them information, and insuring their safety; and

Whereas, Public Safety Telecommunicators of the Post Falls Communications Center have contributed substantially to the apprehension of criminals, suppression of fires, and treatment of patients; and

Whereas, each dispatcher has exhibited a compassion, understanding, and professionalism during the performance of their job for the past year.

Now, therefore, it is proclaimed, by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Post Falls, Idaho, officially declares the second week of April to be observed as National Telecommunicator's Week annually in the City of Post Falls, to recognize and honor our Public Safety Telecommunications personnel and the vital contributions they make to the safety and well-being of our citizens.
